### The ISSUE

4 out of 5 people who are blind don't need to be. Eye diseases like cataract, trachoma and diabetic retinopathy lead to permanent blindness when often, these conditions are treatable or preventable with simple and affordable solutions.

## AN IMPACTFUL PARTNERSHIP

Examples of the collective impact of **donations:**

- > **10 employees (\$1,040 pa)**  
Could fund the training of one basic eye doctor in Vietnam
- > **50 employees (\$5,200 pa)**  
Could provide trachoma trichiasis surgery for up to 100 people in Ethiopia
- > **100 employees (\$10,400)**  
Could fund an entire Outreach Medical Eye Clinic in Nepal



Examples of ways in which your staff could be **further engaged:**

- > Quarterly newsletters and regular updates
- > Events – Sydney and Melbourne Coastrek
- > Volunteer opportunities and pro- bono support
- > Potential to visit program work

Examples assume each employee donates \$2 per week.

We are independent, not-for-profit, politically unaligned and secular.

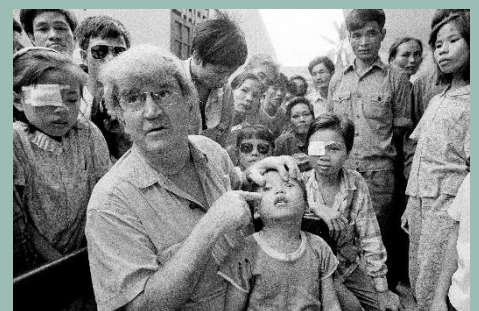
